And everywhere.

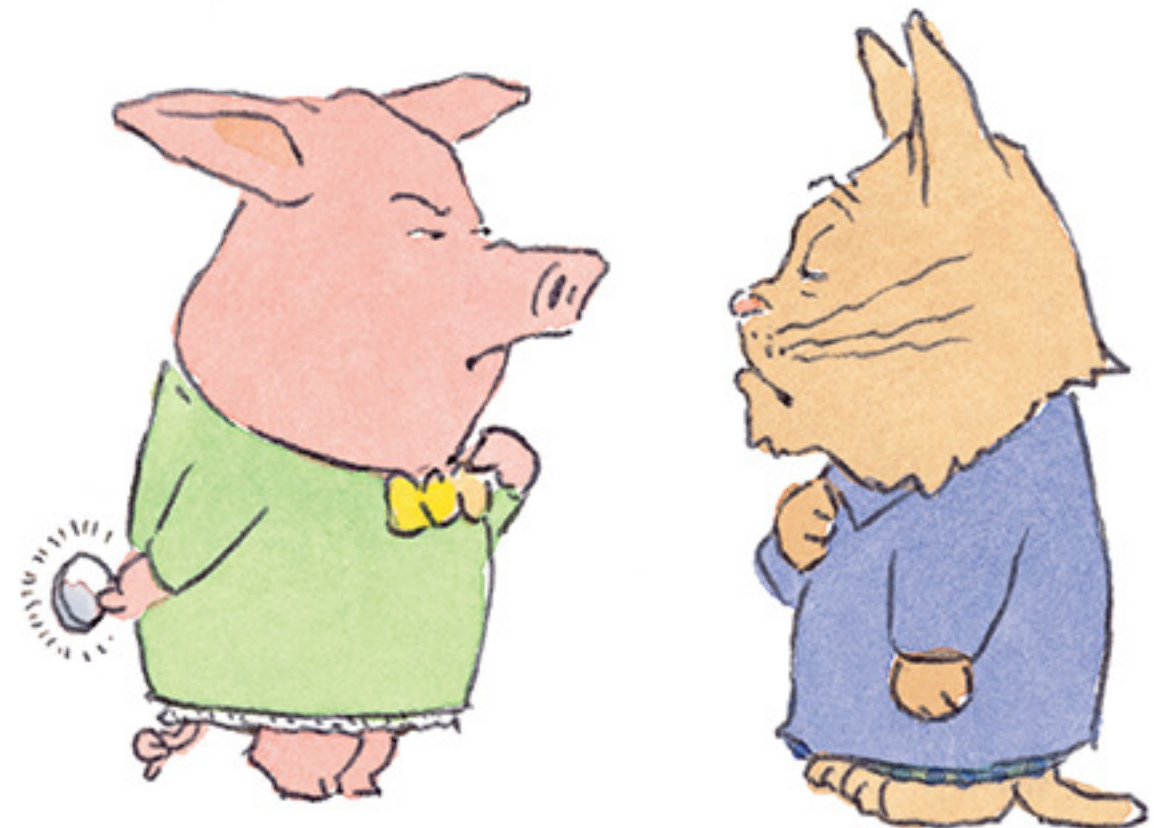
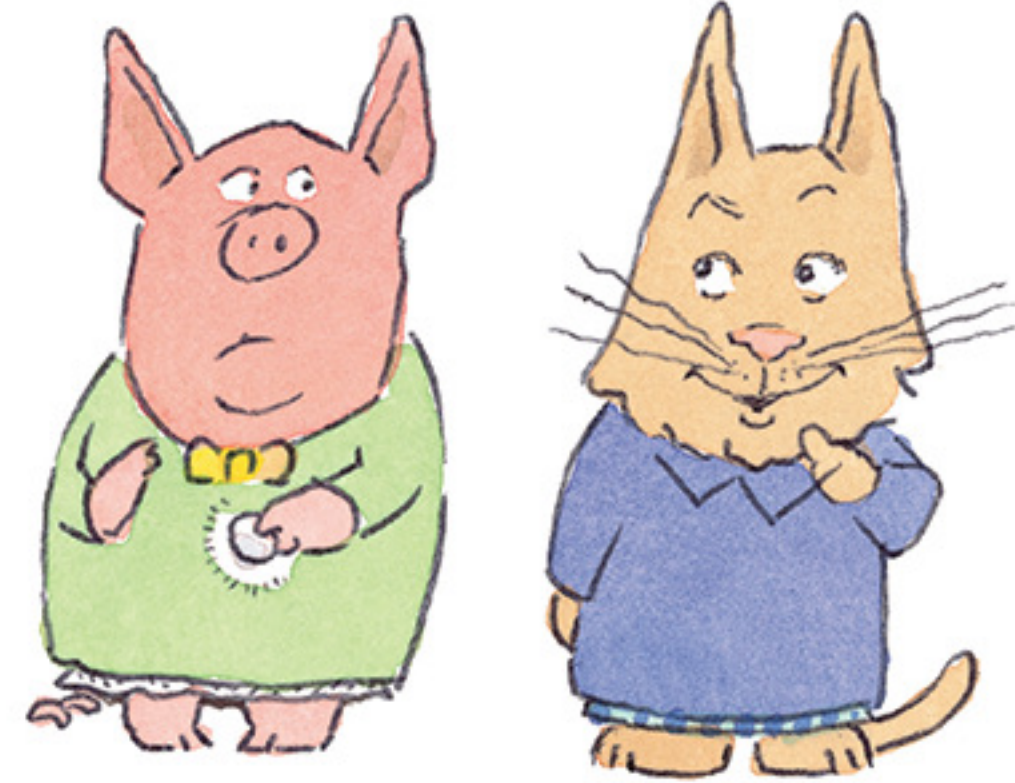
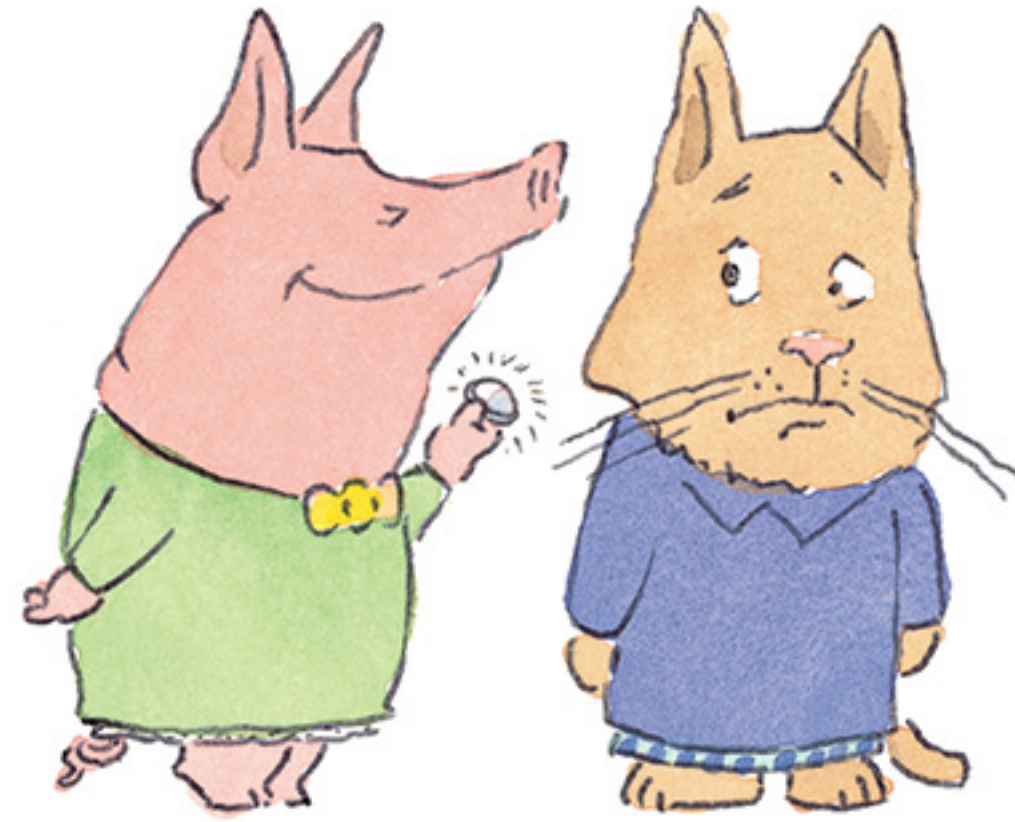
I lost a dime.

One thing to share?

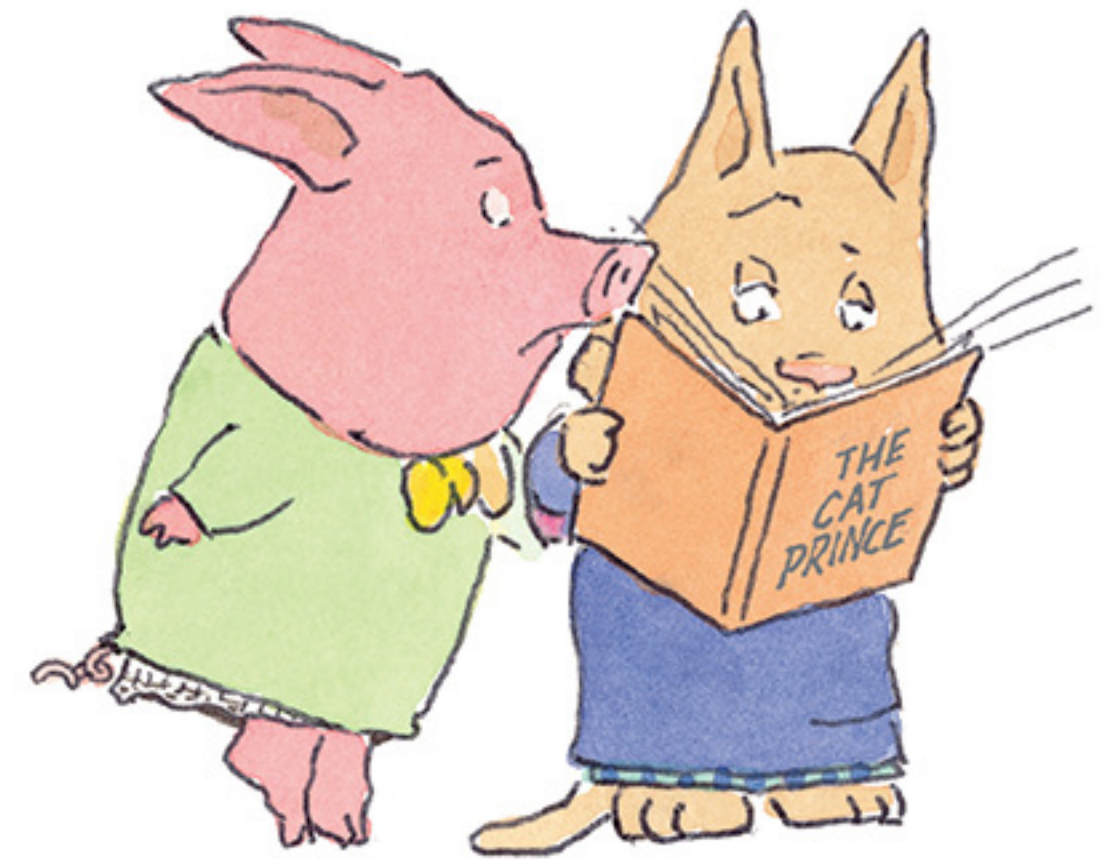
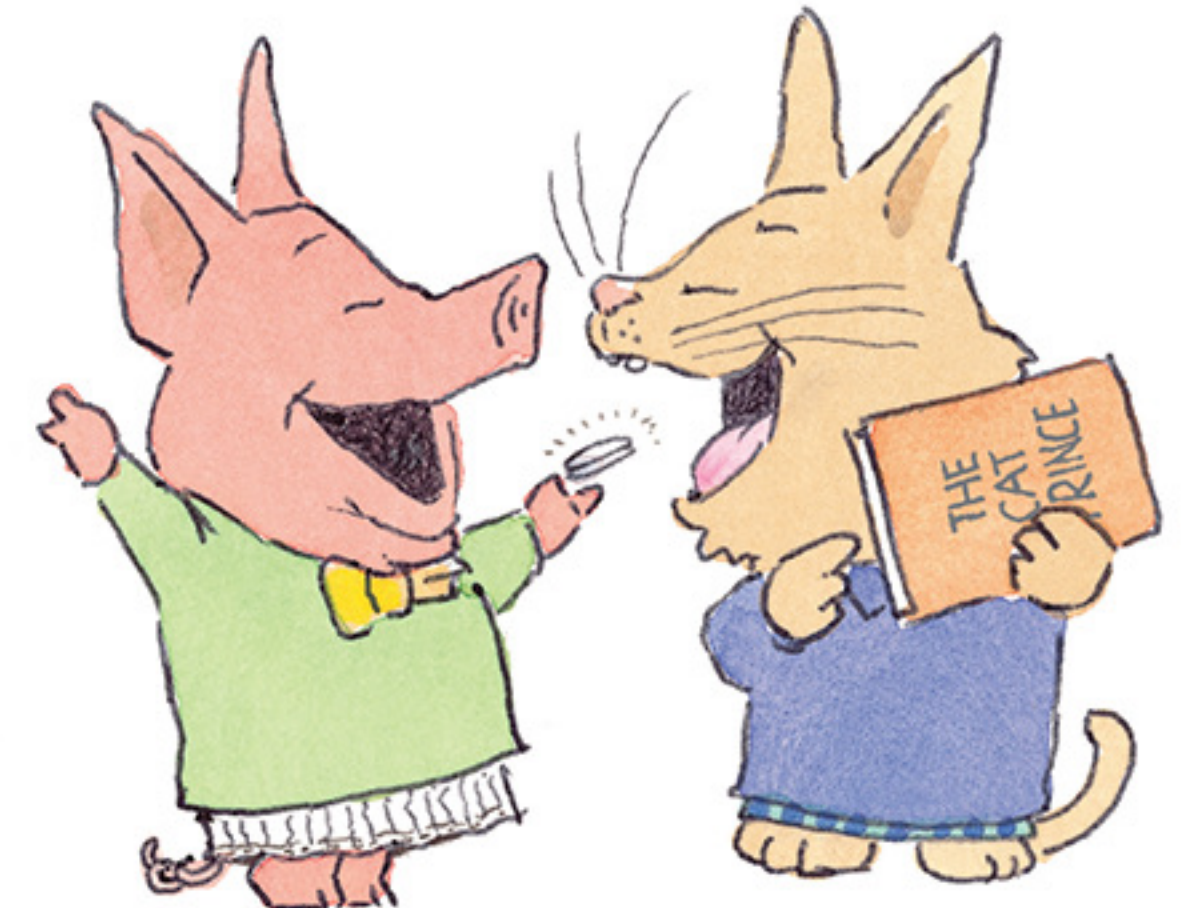
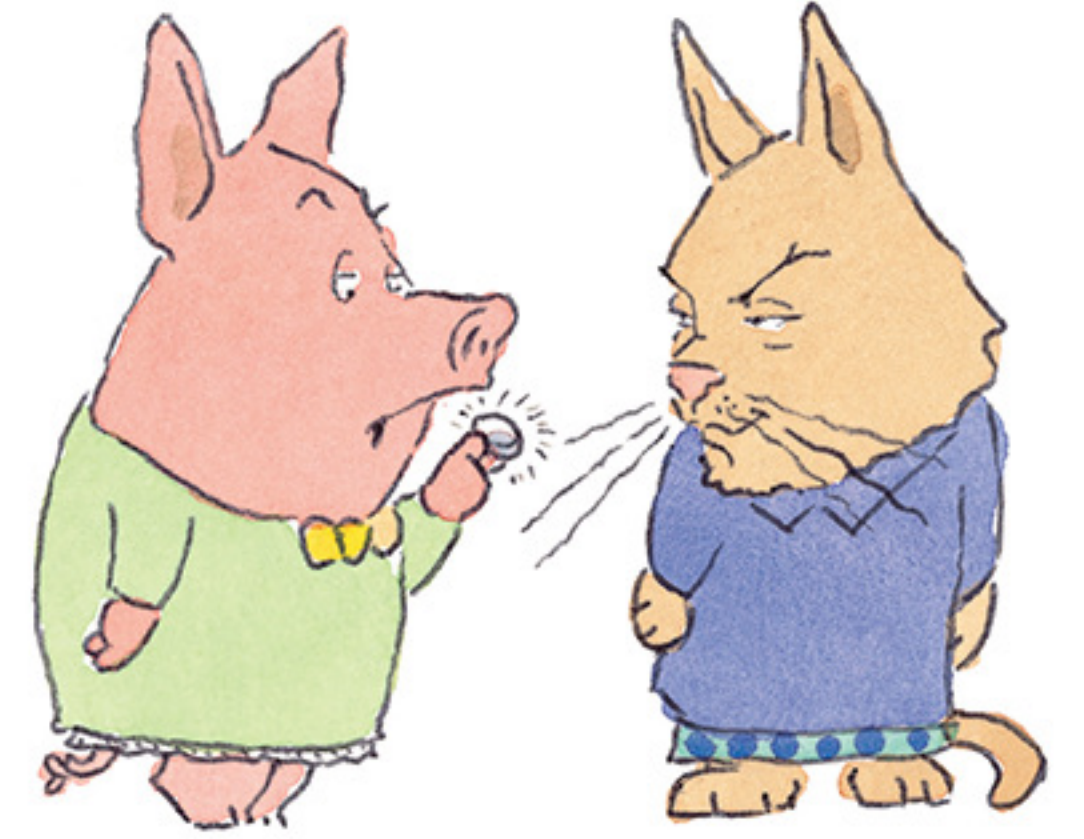
That would be fun.
